

Information for Safety Management Planning: Nōku te Ao Capital E

This information assists you to complete safety management planning for your education setting, and outlines measures to prevent or minimise hazards and injury while visiting our site.

Location

Nōku te Ao Capital E is located in the TSB Arena Building, 4 Queen’s Wharf, Wellington. [View in map](#)

Teacher and adult supervision

At least one registered teacher must accompany school visits to Nōku te Ao Capital E. Please use your school’s adult to child ratio. We suggest a ratio of one adult for every eight students. Teachers and accompanying adults are responsible for the overall safety, security and supervision of their group of children, and should bring a list of children’s emergency contact numbers.

Fire safety, lockdown and earthquake procedures, including procedures for evacuation

Hazard	Action
Earthquake	All children and adults immediately drop, cover and hold where they are. Keep away from windows and large items of furniture. Follow instructions of the Nōku te Ao Capital E learning specialists or warden. Once safe to do so, evacuate your group to your planned safe zone.
Tsunami	Follow instructions of the Nōku te Ao Capital E learning specialists or warden. Our planned tsunami safe zone is Space Place, a map can be found here . Once safe to do so, evacuate your group to your planned safe zone.
Fire	Follow instructions of the Nōku te Ao Capital E learning specialists or warden who will walk the group from the building. Assemble next to the yellow funnel by Taumata in Queens Wharf.
Evacuation	Emergency evacuation procedures are on the wall near emergency exits. Follow instructions of the Nōku te Ao Capital E learning specialists or warden. Evacuate out the emergency exits onto Queens Wharf if it is safe to do so. All belongings except for emergency grab bags should be left behind.
Terror attack/ lockdown	If advised by Police, the Nōku te Ao Capital E learning specialists or warden will lock all entrances and exits to the building. Remain inside the building under the supervision of Nōku te Ao Capital E learning specialists or warden until the ‘All clear’ is given.
COVID-19	Teachers/supervisors, or children who are unwell should stay at home. Nōku te Ao Capital E learning specialists with cold or flu-like symptoms will also remain at home. Practice essential hygiene precautions such as regular hand-washing and use of hand sanitizer that is available onsite.

First aid and defibrillator sites

The first aid kit is in each space and behind the front desk in PlayHQ.

The closest defibrillator is behind the desk at Wellington Museum.

Security and other site users

Nōku te Ao Capital E staff and PlayHQ visitors are in other parts of the building. All entrances are supervised or locked.

Risk assessment information, including key hazards

Hazard	Prevention and minimization	Action
Traffic safety	A busy, shared laneway sits between Nōku te Ao Capital E and Wellington Museum.	Teachers supervise ākonga as they arrive and leave the session.
Children leaving unattended	Nōku te Ao Capital E staff are aware of children's movements within the building, however it may be possible for children to leave unnoticed.	Teachers and accompanying adults must know where children are at all times.
Equipment tipping over or tripping	All large equipment is securely fastened to the floor or walls. Smaller items such as stools are routinely monitored and straightened up throughout the day.	Advise Nōku te Ao Capital E learning specialist. Minor injuries will be treated by a Nōku te Ao Capital E first aid certified staff member. For major injuries 111 will be called.
Slipping on wet floor	Wet floor signs will be put up, groups will be notified of any known wet areas when they are on site.	Advise Nōku te Ao Capital E learning specialist. Minor injuries will be treated by a Nōku te Ao Capital E first aid certified staff member. For major injuries 111 will be called.

Washing and toilet facilities, including unisex facilities, and safety measures in place

All toilets are unisex. The facilities are shared with other Nōku te Ao Capital E users. Accessible and parenting room toilets are available. All toilets have doors that lock and lights that remain on. Teachers and accompanying adults should use their school protocols around toileting.
